



A2 Results Success

Jubilant Scenes at St. Louis as Students Celebrate 'A' Level Success



This year, over 80% of grades achieved at A2 level were A*- C, with 41% of grades A*or A. St. Louis Principal, Mr. Kevin Martin, praised the students and offered words of congratulations to them on their excellent performance in their A2/AS examinations. 'These students are certainly reaping the fruits of their commitment and hard work. Their success provides us with a source of immense pride. The whole school community, especially parents and staff members, wish them well as they move on to the next stage of their academic lives whether it is in higher education or another career path,' he stated.

The majority of students who attended the school on Thursday to collect their results had already accepted their chosen university place, with 75% of St Louis students achieving their firm first choice degree course. Such exceptional A Level results from a cohort of excellent students has enabled St Louis students to commence a degree course or higher-level apprenticeship that reflect their unique gifts and talents, personal qualities, and academic acumen. Acceptance into QUB and Ulster University is high with students commencing courses in Mathematics, Physics, PPE, Accounting, Computing and Business in addition to Music, Art, and Creative Technologies. Results Day brought great delight to those successful in attaining places on highly competitive courses such as Social Work, Nursing, Paramedic Science and Allied Health. We also wish good luck and continued success to our students embarking on degree studies in Medicine, Mathematics, Economics, Law, Business, Events Management and Teaching, in University College London, King's College London, Keele, Liverpool, Edge Hill and Swansea, respectively.

Mr Martin continued, 'Results at AS level were also very good, with the performance of the Year 13 students, once again, ensuring a solid foundation for their future studies.'

Mr Martin thanked everyone involved in making this day so special: students for their commitment to their studies, teachers for their expertise and guidance, and parents for their willing support.

Following on from the fabulous efforts of St. Louis senior students who received wonderful AS and A2 results last week, it was now the turn of the Year 12 students to bask in success.

Head of Year 12, Ms Shirley Edgar, congratulated students and their parents as they opened their envelopes containing the details of their wonderful achievements. "These students have applied themselves well to their studies and I'm delighted that they have reaped such rewards," declared a delighted Ms Edgar.

With the new academic year commencing almost immediately, the majority of these students will continue their studies at AS/A2 Level and BTEC Level 3, at St. Louis.
